COVID AND SUICIDE IDEATION


Emergency care visits for suicidal ideation and/or self-harm in 2020 is SIMILAR TO PREVIOUS YEARS DESPITE AN APPROXIMATE 10% DROP IN VISITS to the ED and urgent care, likely due to COVID.

December 2020 saw an INCREASE
FROM PAST YEARS IN VISITS FOR
SUICIDAL IDEATION AND SELF-HARM
despite the drop in ED/urgent care visits.
